## ACTIVITIES

- Attend a library program.
- Read in a tent or fort, or on a blanket outside under a tree.
- Put on your favorite song and show off silly dance moves.
- Read before you go to bed.
- Make up a silly song about everyday activities.
- Look at the covers of books together. Talk about what the book might be about.
- Pick out a family snapshot or random picture and ask your child to tell you about it.
- Sing one of your children's favorite books.
- Make funny faces. This helps children learn to read facial expressions.
- Go to the library and pick out a book about summer.
- Sort items from your grocery bag together.
- Play "Follow the Leader" outside.
- At bedtime, talk about where various animals sleep at night.
- Play with fabric scraps or scarves. (with supervision, of course)
- Build with blocks. Babies learn about spatial relationships and when they play with blocks.
- Draw a picture for a grandparent or other important person. Be sure to "sign" it.
- Repeat the sounds your baby makes - even before they can speak, babies are listening carefully.
- Talk about bigger and smaller. What's bigger - a cat or a house?
- Visit a park and play together.
